Donor Network of Arizona begins as Arizona Organ and Tissue Bank (AOTB)

1986

AOTB becomes full service with the addition of ocular recovery. We become Donor Network of Arizona

1993

Incorporate an Immunogenetics laboratory

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1997

DNA now serves the entire state of Arizona

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Today

AOTB becomes a community
Accepted based, independent organization

1992

Acquire Lyons Eye Bank, making us the only ocular recovery organization in the state of Arizona

1995

First Full year offering Birth Tissue Donation



Why?

- Flexibility to evolve our initial approach to the donation conversation
- Expanded donation options for families
